Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a CERTIFICATE of the Register of the Land Office at Winnebago City Minnesota, whereby it appears that pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of George Van Amber

has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law for the South East quarter of Section Three, in Township One hundred and Four, of Range Twenty nine, in the District of lands formerly subject to sale at Winnebago City now Jackson Minnesota, containing One hundred and sixty acres.

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office by the SURVEYOR GENERAL.

Now know ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said George Van Amber the tract of Land above described: To Have and to Hold the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said George Van Amber and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony whereof, I, Ulysses S. Grant, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
